
## Public Institution Health Centre of Sarajevo Canton

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- The PI Health Centre of Sarajevo Canton is the **largest institution in Bosnia and Herzegovina** providing primary health care, as well as some specialty consultative services.



- The population of Sarajevo Canton: around 440,000
- The Centre has 10 organisational units health centres throughout the Canton municipalities
- 79 family medicine outpatient clinics
- The **total of 2031 employees** in the medical and administrative sectors

## **The Family Practice**

The Family Practice provides health care to citizens older than 14 (fourteen). It carries out activities on health promotion through direct and continuous protection of individuals and families. These activities are conducted in outpatient clinics and at patients' homes and they include: health education, ambulatory diagnosis and treatment, control and systematic examinations, working with chronic patients, providing emergency medical care, issuing of health certificates and assessment of work ability.

The Family Practice coordinates its work with all other departments in the Health Centre of Sarajevo Canton and other cantonal health institutions in order to provide more comprehensive and quality health care to the population, as well as with the aim of keeping health records and health statistics.

- The most frequent diseases in primary health care in 2017:
  - 1. Hypertension
  - 2. Acute upper respiratory tract infections
  - 3. Diabetes Mellitus
  - 4. Cystitis and urinary tract infections
